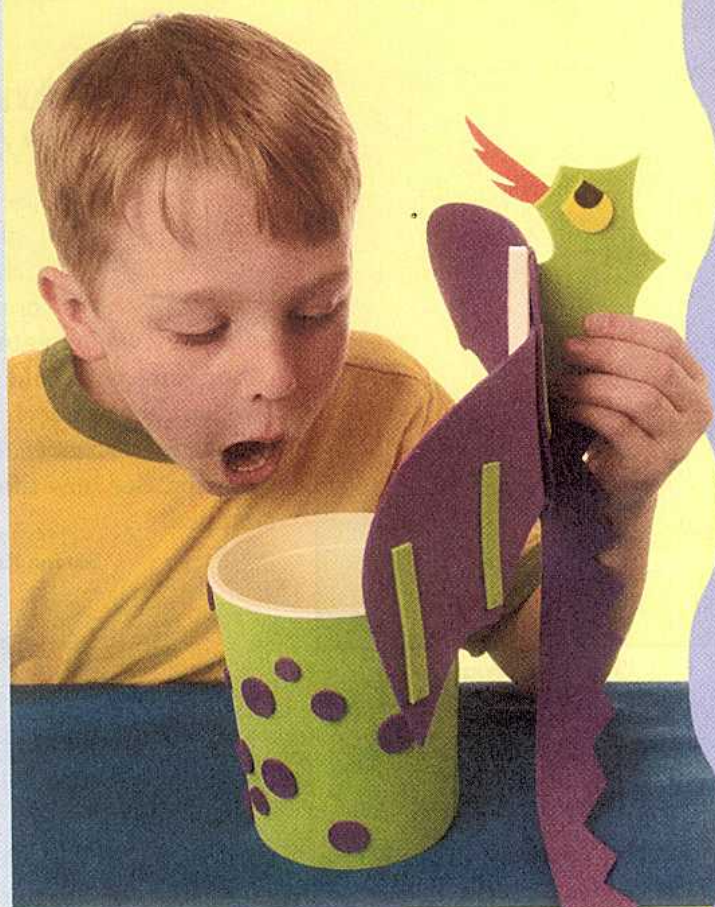




Set a silly turkey on your table

1. Glue **feathers** to a **large brown pompom**. Let them dry.
2. For legs, bend a **chenille stick** in half, and twist the folded or bent end. Bend the legs to look wobbly. Glue the legs to the bottom of the pompom.
3. For the neck and head, bend another chenille stick into thirds, then twist it together. Bend one end over. Glue the neck to the pompom. Let it dry.
4. For a wattle, cut a red chenille stick in half. Fold one piece in half and twist it. Bend one end over the "beak." Pinch it together to secure it. Glue on **wiggle eyes**. Let the turkey dry completely.



A dragon will guard your treasure

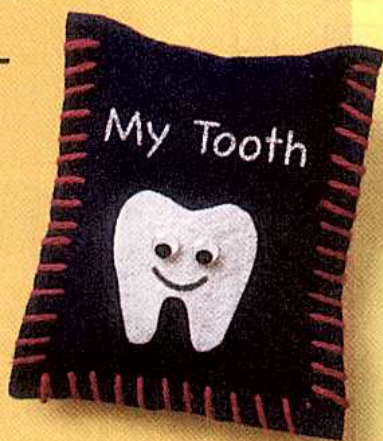

1. Cut **craft foam** to cover the outside of a large empty **plastic container**. Glue it in place. Secure it with **rubber bands** until the glue dries.
2. From craft foam, cut two identical head shapes with one-inch tabs at the neck. Place the heads so that they line up. Bend the tab pieces outward, and **staple** or **tape** them to the container's **lid**.
3. Cut two wings and a tail from craft foam. Staple or tape the wings to the lid. Glue the front of the tail between the two head pieces. **Paper-clip** them together until the glue dries.
4. Cut two foam circles to cover the lid. Glue one to the underside of the lid and the other to the top, cutting a slit for the head. Secure the foam circles with paper clips until they dry.
5. Decorate your dragon with cut foam, and give it some treasures to guard.

Make a tooth-fairy pillow

1. For a pillow, cut a 12-inch-by-4¹/₂-inch piece of **felt**. Fold it in half.
2. Cut a tooth shape from felt. Use **tacky craft glue** to glue the shape to one side of the pillow piece, leaving an open pocket at the top. Decorate the tooth shape with a **fabric pen** and **wiggle eyes**. Let the ink and glue dry.
3. With a **needle** and a long piece of **yarn**, sew the outside edge of the folded felt, leaving about two inches open. Stuff the pillow with **cotton**, and finish sewing.
